


Keynote address was given by **Mr.Rama.Subramaniam**, Joint Director(Retd) & Professor, Agriculture Department of Nandha Engineering College. In the first technical session **Mr.Kumarasamy**, Joint Director, Agricultural Department, Bhavani gave a lecture on "New Technologies in Agricultural Production" in which he spoke in detail about the recent technological support offered to the farmers for increasing their production. His session kindled the minds of the farmers and they asked questions to clarify the usage of technology in agriculture.

The second session included a talk by **Mr.Rama.Subramaniam**, Joint Director(Retd) & Professor, Agriculture Department of Nandha Engineering College on "Marketing and Value Addition". He interestingly, took the participants to the paddy fields and demonstrated on the topic directly and clarified the doubts of the farmers. Farmers were also given information regarding the usage and purchase of the pesticides and fertilizers. They were advised to purchase them in the Govt. Co-operative societies rather than buying in the commercial markets. Organic farming and organic manures, Vermicomposts were also discussed during this session.

Mrs.V.Renuka Devi, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, Vellalar College for Women Erode proposed the vote of thanks. About 50 farmers from in and around Chinnapuliur Village and 10 students attended the programme and got benefited. Saplings and organic fertilizers were then distributed to the farmers.

In the valedictory session feedbacks were collected from the farmers and certificates were distributed.

Report

To create awareness on Health and Hygiene, a Campaign was organized by Youth Red Cross Society at Veppampalayam village, Erode on **21.08.18**. The theme of the Campaign was “Open Defection Free” status of the villages. In connection with this, the YRC volunteers stressed the importance of hygiene to **32** Government Primary School students by way of giving lecture and projecting hygiene related videos. On the same day, a survey was carried to estimate the number of persons using home toilets, public toilets and open area. This survey involved house to house visits (**116**) by the YRC volunteers. The overall aim of the programme was to create awareness on cleanliness and to eliminate upon defecation through the conclusion of household-owned and community-owned toilets establishing an accountable mechanism of monitoring toilet use. A total of **220** students participated in this programme.

Open Defecation Free: Survey at Semmampalyam Village

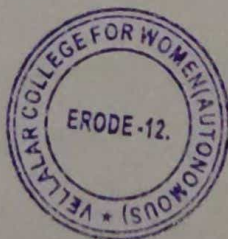

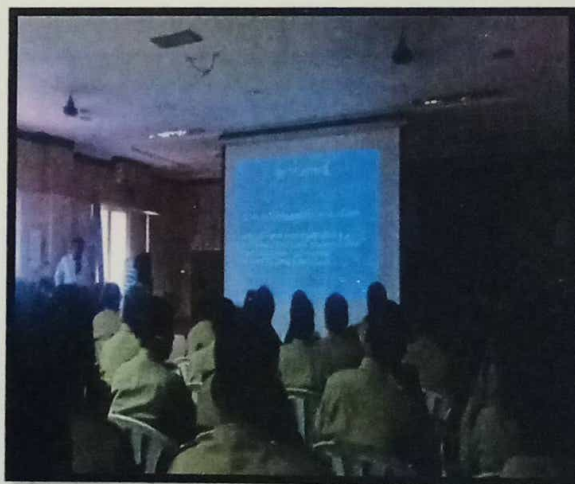
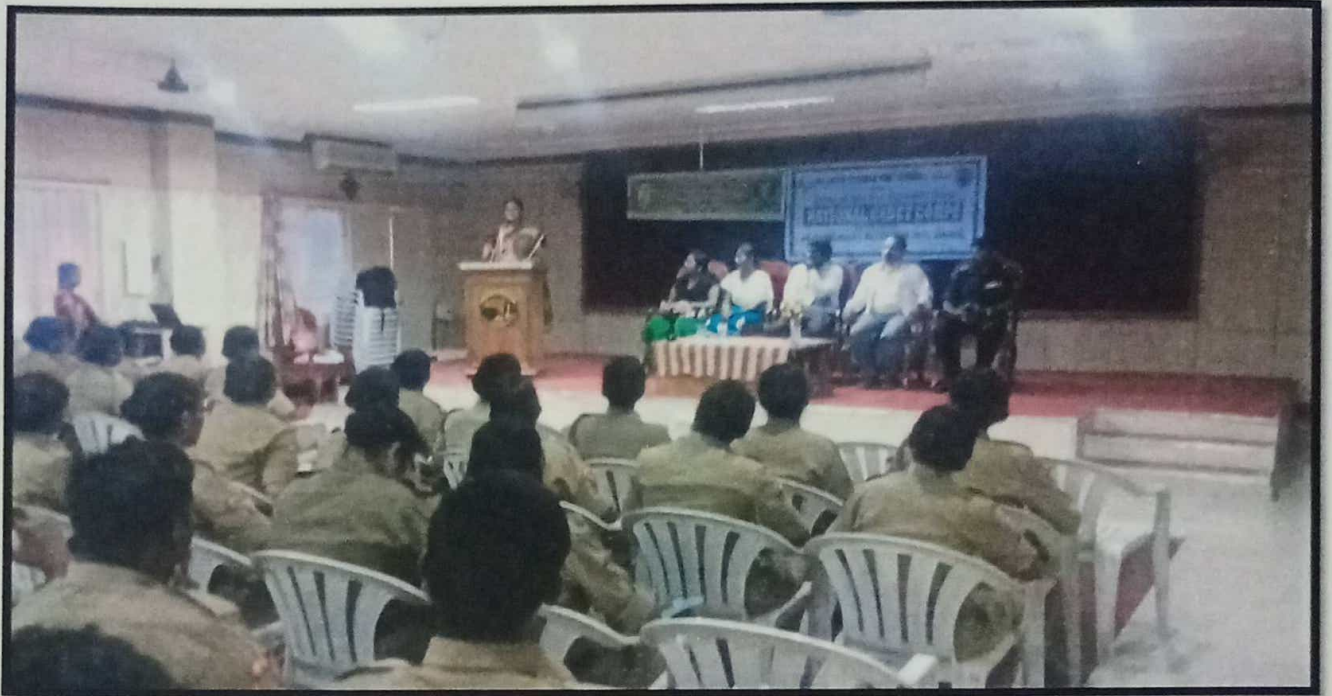
80 NCC Cadets of Vellalar College for Women took part in the Drug Abuses and its Trafficking Awareness Programme on 26th June, 2018 with Dr. Rajesh Kalam, Psychiatrist (Ex. IAF) M.Sc.(Psy),MS(Couns &Psy), PGDMSM(BVB), Ph.D, Government Hospital, Erode and his team. The United Nations' (UN) International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking falls on June 26th each year to raise awareness among public. The programme started at 3.00pm and ended at 4.30pm. A team of Doctors from Om Sakthi Hospital gave a seminar on the Drug Abuses and its Trafficking. Subedar Murugesan was also present. The doctors' team was headed by Dr. Anand Kumar, who is a Psychiatrist.

Dr. Anand Kumar gave a clear presentation about Drug Addiction and its Effects. Addiction is defined as a chronic, relapsing brain disease that is characterized by compulsive drug seeking and use, despite harmful consequences. It is considered a brain disease because drugs change the brain—they change its structure and how it works. These brain changes can be long-lasting, and can lead to the harmful behaviours seen in people who abuse drugs. Now-a-days, the Youngsters are more prone to drug addiction, as adolescents and young adults in high school and college face many unique pressures and stressors in their lives. Young adults or teenagers may feel that alcohol and drugs may help them fit in socially. Substance abuse can reduce inhibitions, and raise self-confidence levels temporarily. Drugs and alcohol can potentially numb or minimize difficult emotions for a short time and may provide a desired escape from reality. But, the drugs have hazardous effects. The cadets learned how to defend themselves against drug addiction.

Dr. Rajesh, who is a Psychology, explained about the ways to live a mentally healthy life. He made a marvellous speech which was acknowledged by the Cadets. A mental illness is a physical illness of the brain that causes disturbance in thinking, behaviour, energy or emotion that makes it difficult to cope with the ordinary demands of life. Both addiction and mental illness are often considered developmental diseases. Mental illnesses affect 19% of the adult population, 46% of teenagers and 13% of children each year. Trees contribute to their environment by providing oxygen, improving air quality, climate amelioration, conserving water, preserving soil, and supporting wildlife. During the process of photosynthesis, trees take in carbon dioxide and produce the oxygen we breathe. Trees also preserve warmth by providing a screen from harsh wind. In addition to influencing wind speed and direction, they shield us from the downfall of rain, sleet and hail. Trees also lower the air temperature and reduce the heat intensity of the greenhouse effect by maintaining low levels of carbon dioxide. Far reaching roots hold soil in place and fight erosion. Trees absorb and store rainwater which reduce runoff and sediment deposit after storms. This helps the ground water supply recharge, prevents the transport of chemicals into streams and prevents flooding. Fallen leaves make excellent compost that enriches soil. Trees are very helpful to humans, but we just cut them off without any concern. Hence, to spread awareness among people about tree plantation and to reduce Deforestation, the cadets took part in this programme. The cadet's hard work will be fruitful to the future generation and the society. The cadets sincerely did the service which made the programme a successful one.
